YEAR IN REVIEW



2010 proved to be a busy year for DATV. One which brought challenges, transitions and successes.

Technology

With help from the city of Dayton, DATV successfully set up a direct fiber path to the city's government channel. This link allows DATV and DGTV to transmit programs and files back and forth with ease. Additionally, DATV increased its internet bandwidth capabilities allowing producers to submit their shows to us over the internet. This has proven very popular and we continue to research, test and fine tune this technology to best fit the needs of our users.

Transitions

Due to channel realignments by the cable company, DATV saw both of its channels moved to different locations on the system. DATV channel 20 was moved to channel 5 on the basic tier which is seen in Dayton, Butler Twp. and Riverside. Dayton Spiritual TV channel 12 was moved to ch. 992 on the digital tier giving this channel a larger geographical footprint allowing for viewership throughout the entire Miami Valley.

Staffing

DATV was met with the retirement of Volunteer Coordinator, Dorothy Beatty. Dorothy served DATV for over 20 years and her service was greatly appreciated. As a result, Prod. Asst. Dale Grow moved into that position and has done a great job. Other departures were long time Prod. Asst. Greg Tucker and Patrick Hughes.

Highlights

DATV's continued its fundraising efforts and were once again successful with the DATV Fishing Derby and the Media That Matters Film Festival.

DATV was successful in having a Resolution passed by the City in support of the Community Access Preservation Act or CAP Act. This resolution currently in congress seeks to reverse many of the damages caused by statewide franchising. We thank the city of Dayton for their support on this resolution.

Final Thoughts

DATV faces many challenges in the coming months. Some of those challenges are technological and some challenges that threaten the very existence of PEG access around the country. With our membership, DATV will meet those challenges head on will continue its 33 year mission of providing the community the "Freedom to Communicate."

DATV members may reserve equipment to help them produce their programs. It is available to members on a first come, first serve basis. There are 3 full size DV and 8 mini DV cameras available for member use. In addition to the 4 edit suites with both tapeto-tape editing and AVID nonlinear systems, DATV has 4 stand alone AVID edit systems and a studio control room.

DATV's membership reached 383 during the year 2010.
