



The Funk Chronicles

For the second straight year DATV has been named the winner of the Philo T. Farnsworth Award for Overall Excellence in Public Access Programming. The award, which is presented by the Alliance for Community Media's Central States is made up of public, educational,

and government access centers from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, and Kentucky. The Overall Excellence award recognizes the finest in community programming and is a tribute to the hard work and dedication put forth by both DATV community producers and DATV staff, says DATV Programming Director, Melissa Constantine.

In addition, The Funk Chronicles won 2 Philo Awards and was a finalist in a third category in the 4-state competition. Winning entries were in the Non-Professional category for Arts/ Cultural Awareness, an Interview with Tommy Davidson, and Non-Professional Entertainment which showcased an interview with funk leend, Gary "Mudbone" Cooper. "We think it's important to educate people on the history of funk music and how it has influenced many of today's great artists" says the show's Executive Producer, David R. Webb.
