

Where has community activism gone?

Public-access television is traditionally a form of non-commercial mass media where the general public can create content television programming which is narrowcast through cable TV specialty channels.

Though technically true, public access television was created to give the common person access to technology only enjoyed by large commercial and/or government entities. This technology was to serve as a way for citizens to communicate with their communities and governments.

Many producers created programs on topics or issues in their communities that were of a concern to them. Others

created programs showcasing talents such as cooking, playing an instrument, creating art, etc.

In today's public access, not much has changed as far as content. The biggest change came in the form of technology. Today, community producers have cameras, equipment, editing, and studio facilities that rival that of their commercial brothers. This technology has made it easier and more affordable for local producers to reach out to the masses, but has it made us forget our roots in public access?

Today we can add as much glitz and glitter to our shows an anyone. However, I feel the intent of our programs gets lost in the technology. Just because we can make something swirl, flash, or fly around doesn't mean it adds to the intent of the show.

I'm reminded of a show that was produced at DATV, "Hope VI", which focused on a company's efforts to bring a chemical waste plant to a local community. It was through the efforts of a community producer and then DATV staff person that a video was produced educating that community as to the negative impact the plant would have. As a result of their efforts, this plan was aborted.

This was community activism at its finest. Keep this in mind the next time you're looking for subject matter. Remember, you have access to everything you need.
