SPRING INTERNSHIP

The University of Dayton has had the honor of continuing its partnership with Dayton Access Television this year through the integration of a spring Intern. My name is John Evans and I am currently interning for DATV this spring semester of 2023. Working with Dayton Access Television as their spring semester Intern has been rewarding in a number of ways. I have been able to learn and develop technical skills within the broadcasting industry. Interning at DATV studio allows me the opportunity to use video and audio equipment to create and produce original content for myself and the Dayton community. It's been an amazing experience to understand how to operate a camera and edit footage through software many professionals use in the field.

The structure of my internship is outlined through a training process. Coming into DATV with minimal knowledge of equipment use and broadcasting strategies, I found myself seeking guidance in many ways. DATV provided confident and supportive training with hands-on practices that really allowed me to become comfortable with content creation.

Beginning with camera use, I was able to film my first video with audio and visual editing. The studio offered me the opportunity to learn and adjust stage lighting and other staging elements while I began to film and host the second longest running LGBT program on DATV, *Queeries*?.

By interning with DATV, I was introduced with the opportunity to host the show *Queeries*?. My interpersonal skills related to journalism were put to the test while interviewing guests from the Dayton community. Working with *Queeries*? and further expanding my knowledge of the resources offered at Dayton Access Television sparked my interests in creating my own program for the channel.

A particular resource I have been working with has been the Podcast studio at Dayton Access Television. Podcasting has been on the sharp rise since quarantine, as individuals are creating a multitude of shows both with audio and visual elements. DATV offers both a podcast studio with solely audio equipment and a studio with cameras. I have been working to master the use of the studios and create my own original podcast through Dayton Access Television. If interested in a program concerning relatable content for young adults facing current obstacles in a post-lockdown world, tune into the upcoming Podcast "Twenty in the Twenties", featuring me, John Evans, as host. Dayton Access Television has proven time and time again the adaptability of broadcasting, especially within the local access field.

It was Roxie Cole, then Executive Director who hired Steve as Operations Manager at Access-30-Dayton.

FROM THE VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR'S DESK

At the heart of Dayton Access Television is the training, equipment and facilities for Dayton residents to create programs that inform and entertain the Miami Valley. The programs produced by people "just like you" are seen on Spectrum Cable Channel 5 in Dayton, Butler Township and Riverside and Spiritual programs are seen on Channel 992 over most of Southwest Ohio. Training to use state of the art cameras, editing and studio are done in such a way as to make it easy for the novice video producer to create great programming for and about the community. Workshops are designed to allow students to learn the basic elements of television production in just a few days. This allows DATV Members to go to work right away on their productions. Between Field Production and Editing, a DATV Member can learn enough to record their program and then edit it for broadcast on television in just four days.

Dayton Access Television and its sister station Dayton Spiritual Television are

showcases for original programs as well as church services and Bible studies that reach people throughout the community. It lends a greater voice to the people. Individuals from 14 to 94 can learn how to become an artist and use the editing software provided as a palette. Members can have their programs on Spectrum Cable, and they can share their programs through the On-Demand section of www.datv. org. Not only can they reach thousands in the community, but now millions around the world! DATV is a beacon of free speech since 1978 and continues to give people the "Freedom to Communicate".

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





BOSNIAN STUDENTS VISIT

MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN OTHER COUNTRIES

DATV received an exciting visit from students from Bosnia and Hezeogovina in 2022.

About 27 students in all, including their teachers, our guests of the city of Dayton's Mediation Center as part of a student exchange. The students from the cities of Banja Luka, Maglaj, and Tuzla received a grand tour of the city of Dayton visiting many of the area hotspots and learning some of the great historical facts that helped change the world.

Part of their trip included a day long visit to DATV, Dayton's community media station. Their visit consisted of an extensive tour of the facility and included the history of community television in Dayton and the country.



Bosnia and Herzegovina shares boarders with Croatia, Serbia, and Montenegro and roughly 716 miles from Ukraine.





After the tour, the students were broken up into 3 groups for mini-workshops.

Group #1 was in the studio learning to operate the studio cameras, floor direct, and set up microphones for studio shows.

Group #2 learned the fascinating intricacies of the studio control room including the video switcher, audio mixer, teleprompter, robotic camera control unit, and the various duties associated with each.

Group #3 enjoyed their time in DATV's Pod Studio learning how to use the video switcher, audio mixer and cameras in the Pod Studio to make programming for the community.

After several minutes, each group switched places. This resulted in a round-robin of training and learning.

The Fun Begins

Thrilled by what they had just learned, we had them create their own local programs. Still in their groups, some of the students created studio shows interviewing one another about their visit to the U.S. while others operated the equipment. During their recordings, we encouraged them to speak in their native language and to speak freely. The studio shows are part of DATV's series, "Greater Dayton Live" and can be seen on the channel.

At the same time, the third group was in the Podcast Studio making shows concerning issues critical to them and their communities. After some time, they again switched places giving every student the opportunity to learn and create.





It was very exciting to work with these students. They told us they had nothing like DATV at home and were not encouraged to express themselves freely. It was humbling to hear that and to know that we often take for granted the liberties we have in this country. Their teachers were later provided with copies of what the students had produced and the shows can be seen on DATV.



Wayne Broyles – Wayne was a DATV member who moved into a part-time Production Asst. position. A green screen enthusiast, Wayne shared his knowledge with other producers. He also volunteered his time teaching members how to edit their programs.

Cortez Jackson – Cortez produced several spiritual programs on location and in the DATV studio. He was a playwright and produced successful local plays around the Dayton area. Cortez was also a DATV volunteer helping out on both DATV remote productions as well as helping others with their shows.





Brenda Loy – A long-time DATV member and producer, Brenda co-produced the weekly church program, "Way of the Cross" with her husband Joe, for Dayton Spiritual Television for over 25 years. She also volunteered her services on independent productions and helped on DATV productions such as, "Meet the Candidates."

Fred Boomer - Fred was a DATV member, filmmaker, and video enthusiast. He wrote and directed films in the Dayton area and was a member of FilmDayton. He enjoyed visiting DATV and taking the various workshops. He often stopped by just to chat and talk about some of the things he was working on.





Barry Leggett - Barry and his wife Kathy produced a monthly "live" television series called "Dayton Music Scene".
